175 miles altogether.

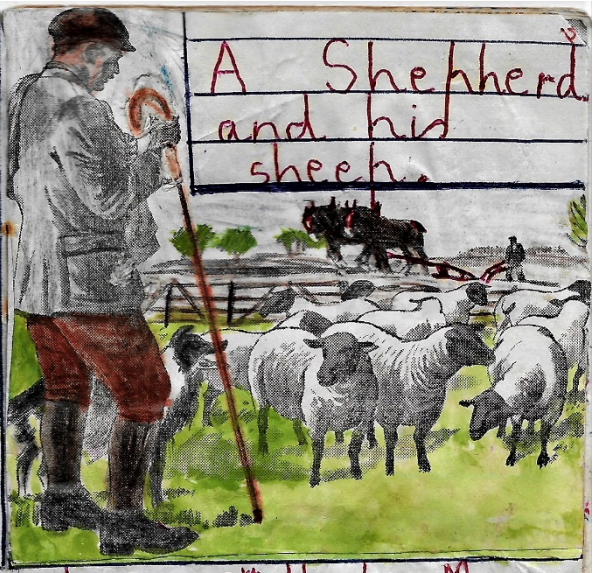
June 6th South Durham

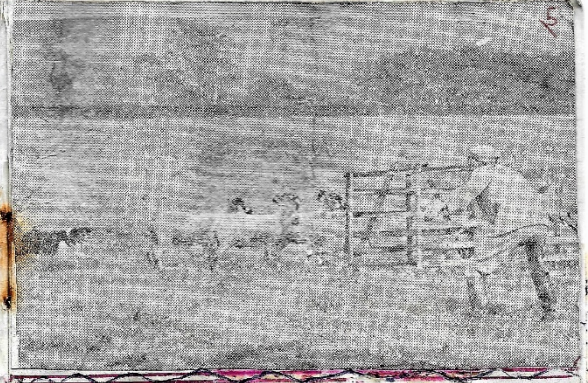
June 18th Harden Moss. Sheep were very difficult to handle.

Also selected were the first three in the double dog class winner of the best driving dog event and the first three in the shepherds class, results of which were published on Saturday.

Kilmsey 6th September. We got 5th prize in the singles and first prize in the doubles.

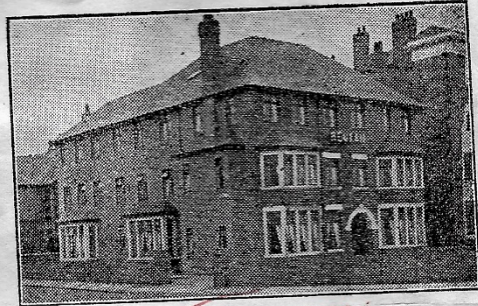
Reeth 7th September.
